

## **Fraser River Discovery Centre programs boosted by Seaspan and Southern Railway of British Columbia**

**December 15, 2021**

**NORTH VANCOUVER, B.C.** – Indigenous and Fraser River Education Programs provided by the Fraser River Discovery Centre Society will be enhanced by a C\$250,000 grant from the Dennis and Phyllis Washington Foundation in conjunction with Seaspan and Southern Railway of British Columbia Limited (SRY). The Dennis and Phyllis Washington Foundation is the charitable arm of the Washington Companies.

The Fraser River Discovery Centre Society (FRDCS), which operates the Fraser River Discovery Centre, based in New Westminster, BC, will receive the grant for Indigenous and Fraser River Education Programs. The funds will specifically support programs in partnership with First Nations (Musqueam Indian Band), including school programs, public information and dialogue programs, and interactive exhibits.

Seaspan and SRY have a long relationship with FRDCS, and previously provided support for their *Journey Through the Working River* exhibit in 2017. FRDCS is currently partnering with the Musqueam Indian Band (MIB) and plans to develop *xʷtatəlləm (Place of Learning About the Indigenous Heritage and Teachings of the Fraser River)*. FRDCS will work with the MIB and other First Nations to share information about the Fraser River and work towards Reconciliation and the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

FRDCS's Fraser River Education Programs will help students explore the Fraser River from economic, environmental, socio-cultural and Indigenous perspectives. They include *RiverSchool* programs on Fraser River transportation and trade which were supported by funding from Seaspan and SRY as well as Indigenous *RiverSchool* programming that was also supported by Seaspan and SRY. All *RiverSchool* programs are linked directly to the BC curriculum and meet learning outcomes in social studies, history, mathematics, and science. Since their inception, *RiverSchool*, has served 25,000 students from over 500 schools.

“On behalf of Seaspan and Southern Railway of British Columbia, we are pleased to be able to support the Fraser River Discovery Centre Society in their work to promote the diverse history and culture associated with the Fraser River. Educational perspectives provided on the environment and transportation will benefit the Fraser River’s long-term sustainability. Their engaging programs highlight the importance of the river and bring an understanding of the livelihoods and communities which depend on it to a wide range of audiences,” said Kyle Washington, Executive Chairman, Seaspan.

“This support from Seaspan and Southern Railway of British Columbia is critical to moving forward with both xʷtatəlləm and our Fraser River Education Programs as we continue to recover from the impacts the COVID-19 pandemic has had on the Fraser River Discovery Centre,” said Mark Rizzo, Chair, Fraser River Discovery Centre Society. “The donation — the single largest we have ever received — helps ensure we can further educate our visitors and the region about the Indigenous, economic, environmental, and socio-economic importance of the living, working Fraser River.”
